

## Combat Medical Ministry Course (CMM-7S)

Course Number: 5G-CMM-7S

Dates: 24 Jan-4 Feb 05  
13-24 Jun 05

Two-week intensive course for chaplains produces additional skill identifier, 7S, Combat Medical Pastoral Care Specialist. One unit of Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) training is a prerequisite. Six competencies are covered: Trauma Ministry, Mass Casualty Ministry, Crisis Ministry, Bio-medical and Battlefield Ethics, Grief, Loss, and Death Ministry, and Spiritual Hope/Suicide Prevention.

Target Group: Chaplains assigned or who will be assigned to hospitals and Combat Stress Control Companies. Chaplain Candidates.

Additional Information: Must meet Army APFT standards or Service Branch equivalent. Must have completed 1 Unit of CPE.

## Emergency Medical Ministry Course

Course Number: 5G-EMM

Dates: 14-25 Mar 05  
12-23 Sep 05

Two-week course providing emergency medical ministry training to battle-proof chaplains and chaplain assistants. The EMM Course is primarily for AC/RC Unit Ministry Teams (UMT), but individuals are welcome. Required training for MEDCOM Chaplain Assistants.

Target Group: Chaplains, Chaplain Candidates, and Chaplain Assistants.

## PROFESSIONAL POSTGRADUATE SHORT COURSES

### Medical Ministry Critical Event Management

Course Number: 6H-300/A0811

Dates: 9-12 Aug 05

**Description of Event:** Training in a selected aspect of Critical Event Management. The training particularly stresses, through multi-media and intense group exercises, and learning such skills as Group Crisis Intervention. *(Meets Chaplaincy Objective 4.1.3)*

Target Group: Chaplains, Chaplain Assistants. Required for MEDCOM Chaplain Assistants assigned to SMART-PC.

### Medical Ministry Homiletics

Course Number: 6H-300/A0815

Dates: 10-13 May 05

**Description of Event:** Course provides chaplains interactive workshop approach to development of sermons for clinical settings. Presentation is followed by small group interaction. Focus is also on how one preaches, style, continuity, techniques for delivery and audience characteristics.

Additional Information: Produces chaplains capable of applying homiletic techniques for the health care environment in the care of medical staff, patients, and the community. *(Meets Chaplaincy Objective 1.1.3)*

## Medical Ministry Spiritual Health

Course Number: 6H-300/A0801

Dates: 3-6 May 05

**Description of Event:** Course teaches various aspects of spiritual formation and spiritual assessment of self and others with the focus on assessing one's own spiritual readiness and how to assist others in their own spiritual formation.

*(Meets Chaplaincy Objective #1.1.2)*

## Medical Ministry Substance Abuse

Course Number: 6H-300/A0804

Dates: 26-29 Jul 05

**Description of Event:** Training chaplaincy to provide ministry and pastoral care to persons with substance abuse problems. Students gain knowledge and understanding of addiction, spiritual aspects of addiction, medical, developmental, social, and cultural issues, and recovery.

*(Supports Chaplaincy Goal2.2)*

Enrollment Information:

Application forms for all courses are available on our website. The Course Manager will send each student an enrollment confirmation memo upon receipt of the application for the course. The Course Manager will enter all students' names and enrollment information into ATRRS after the student reports for the course. Each student will be presented an ATRRS course completion certificate at the course graduation, which is at 1100 on the final Friday of each course.

Housing and Travel:

Whenever possible, students will be housed on the Fort Sam Houston installation. Due to distances, we recommend a rental car for out of town students. Both of the two-week courses involve night and weekend duty at BAMC, so local transportation during these classes is essential. AMEDDC&S requires each student to be present for the entire course, including the graduation. **DO NOT BOOK DEPARTURE FLIGHTS BEFORE 1400 OF THE LAST DAY OF TRAINING.**
